We are an intensive workforce training program teaching the art and skill of professional sewing. This class is offered for free to adults of all backgrounds. Participants are expected to apply for work in the sewing industry upon completion of the class.

Skills covered include:

- Operating a variety of industrial sewing machines

- Sewing a variety of garments and accessories using many different kinds of fabric
- How to cut fabric using a pattern
- The basics of patternmaking
- Introduction to alterations and mending
