Welcome to the finale of fiscal year 2025 at the Topsham Public Library. We are so pleased that you have joined us again, or for the first time, on this journey. As we explored all that the library world map had to offer, we met new players, found equipment to assist our quest, and formed alliances in the community to help us Level Up.

The library adapted to changing circumstances this year as the former leadership retired and left the new administration in charge. Steve and I have worked hard to maintain the legacy and mission of the organization by getting to know the patrons, supporting the staff, and planning for the future.

This next level of adventure also brought the addition of a teen services librarian and the transition of our gallery coordinator. Both positions were filled with people who embody the enthusiasm of being in a library with the knowledge of how to reach their target audience and the skill to coordinate many moving parts. The teen volunteer program has been a particular success for Lindsey, accumulating nearly 270 hours of support and planning activities like the teen poetry walk and outdoor

mini-golf during the summer. Our gallery continues to thrive under Kelsie, featuring over 125 local artists and attracting over 500 visitors to various receptions and events this past year, which do not include all the people who wandered in weekly to view, or even purchase, the art.

As always, our steadfast children's librarian has formed many connections and is often recognized by younglings in the community, including at the fair. She helped to coordinate our involvement in the Topsham Trunk or Treat and advocated to replace the learning computers in the children's area. Big Truck Day, Within the Whale, and Lindsey and her Puppet Pals were the biggest events this year for Ms. Mariah, in addition to visiting with more than a dozen classrooms and joining forces with the librarian at Woodside.

Adult Services Librarian, Emma has also been busy with programming with hits like the Bowdoin Community Concert, Music in March, and various movie screenings. In addition to our free online author talks, we also added a poetry podcast, complemented by in-person readings throughout the month of April. The ever-popular grab bags are still put out in the first week of every month, and our book clubs are full to bursting. Other staff formed a successful film club that meets on the first Monday of each month, when they discuss a pre-selected movie.

The community and staff provided feedback to us about library services, forming the basis of our Long-Range Plan for 2025- 2028. The plan includes goals such as making the library a more welcoming and accessible destination for residents of all ages and abilities and improving access to a broader collection of materials. 



**Town Budget:** The library spent \$849,359.34 of Town funds in FY25, which included staff wages and benefits, technology like new computers and software updates, supplies for covering books and maintaining operations, plus our utilities costs.

**TPL Items purchased:** This chart shows how much we spent on various material types in FY25. The majority is physical books followed by about 39% in digital materials like e-books, e-magazines, and movie streaming, nearly 12% on audiovisual like DVDs and books on CD, and 2% on newspapers or other periodicals.





**Library Income Sources:** The Library has three different sources of income, as represented in this chart. About 83% of our money comes from the Town with 1.5% from the Friends of the Library for programming, and the remaining amount from fundraising, meeting room fees, grants, or other contributions.

**Total Expenditures:** In FY25, we spent \$1,004,125.98 to cover all of the annual operating expenses for the library. This includes staff wages and benefits, materials, supplies, programming, and building upkeep.
